

THE APOSTOLIC ACTIVITIES OF THE DIVINE MASTER MISSIONARIES IN ITS BEGINNING AND AT THE PRESENT TIME

The Chaplaincy of Ngetta National Teachers College

Right when the Association professed Brothers and ordained priests while in Lira Diocese, the founder established two communities:

1. These were the Chaplaincy of Ngetta National Teachers College, where the members of the community provided Chaplaincy and teaching of Teacher Trainees at the National Teachers College.

2. Aloi Technical School

The Missionaries of Jesus the Divine Master also had another community at Aloi Technical School, where the members served as Instructors and chaplains to the Technical Schools.

3. Chaplainy to St. Catherine Secondary School in Lira

The Missionaries of Jesus the Divine Master also served as Chaplain to St. Catherine Secondary School in Lira.

4. From the Novitiate, the priests of the Missionaries of Jesus the Divine Master also provided Masses and administration of the Sacraments to several Schools, including: Dr Obote College, Boroboro Secondary School and Canon Lawrence Primary Teachers College.

Since 1994, when the Missionaries of Jesus the Divine Master came to Arua Diocese, they have been involved in their specific apostolate of Christian Education and the Defence of Catholic Doctrine, which they carry out through institutions of learning and other fora as teachers, Tutors, Professors, Chaplains, Spiritual Directors, Administrators and Parochial apostolate according to the needs of the Church.

The field of activities of the Missionaries of Jesus the Divine Master is the establishment of learning centres at all levels, social communication media, training centres, houses of religious and priestly formation, and all other fora of social interaction, using all available modern approaches and techniques in response to new demands. Specifically, the Missionaries of Jesus the Divine Master are serving in the following Educational Institutions and Parishes:

ARUA DIOCESE

Otumbari Parish

On arrival from Lira in July 1990, Bishop Frederick Drandau appointed the Missionaries of Jesus the Divine Master to Otumbari Parish. That also solved the problem of a Parish which was lacking a priest. Two priests were appointed, and life returned to the Parish. This Parish became the base of the Missionaries of Jesus the Divine Master. Below is the Parish Church and the Fathers' House where the Missionaries of Jesus the Divine Master served.

At the same time, some of the priests served at Sts: Peter and Paul Minor Seminary, Pokea, as Formators, teachers and General Spiritual Director. Below is a picture of the Seminary.

1. **St. John Bosco Primary Teachers' College:** This Teacher Training College trains primary School Teachers in the entire West Nile Region of Uganda. They have trained thousands of Primary School Teachers since 1995; under the Catholic influence, they produce teachers with high moral standards in the country. It has for decades been the best Teacher Training College under the able leadership of the Missionaries of Jesus the Divine Master. They provide support supervision to 384 primary school teachers in the districts of Koboko, Terego, Yumbe, Moyo, Obongi and Adjumani.

Laropi Parish was a Zone Centre under Metu Parish, but the Divine Master Missionaries developed it into a Parish and then served there, leaving Metu for the Diocesans.

They are, currently, serving in the following Institutions and Parishes:

1. **St Mary Assumpta Parish - Pakele:** The Missionaries of Jesus the Divine Master are providing parochial services as well as services at the three (3) Secondary Schools and nineteen (19) Primary Schools, one (1) Institution and thirteen (13) Outstations (Chapels). The Missionaries provide Christian Education in these Schools and administer Sacraments in them routinely.

2. **Holy Cross Pilgrimage Centre - Indriani:** This is a pilgrimage Centre and a Parish, founded by the Missionaries of Jesus the Divine Master. Cardinal Filoni opened it. Pilgrimages are organized by the various Deaneries of the Diocese every month. The Missionaries of Jesus the Divine Master have provided the Rector and the Parish Priest to serve the people of God from all over the Diocese, and to serve two Secondary Schools and five Primary Schools. There are fifteen (15) Chapels. The Missionaries provide Christian Education in these Schools and administer Sacraments in them routinely.

3. **Djaipi Parish:** The Missionaries of Jesus the Divine Master are providing parochial services as well as services at the four (4) Secondary Schools, eighteen (18) Primary Schools, two (2) Religious Institutions and twenty (20) Outstations (Chapels). The Missionaries provide Christian Education in these Schools and administer Sacraments in them routinely.

4. **St. Mary Assumpta Parish, Regem:** The Missionaries of Jesus the Divine Master are providing parochial services as well as services at the one (1) Technical School and two (2) Primary Schools. The Missionaries provide Christian Education in these Schools and administer Sacraments in them routinely.

The Missionaries of Jesus the Divine Master are also serving Asava, an outstation under Christ the King Parish, developing it into Asava Parish in the future.

5. The Missionaries of Jesus the Divine Master also support Christ the King with the celebration of sacraments to the inmates in Uganda Prison, Arua.
6. **St. Mary Assumpta Parish, Oleba:** The Missionaries of Jesus the Divine Master founded the Parish, which provides parochial services as well as services at the two (2) Secondary Schools and five (5) Primary Schools. There are 23 Chapels under the Parish. The Missionaries provide Christian Education in these Schools and administer Sacraments in them routinely.



7. **Arua Technical Institute – Ragem Chaplaincy:** The Missionaries of Jesus the Divine Master are serving in the Chaplaincy of Arua Technical Institute – Ragem Chaplaincy. The Missionaries provide Christian Education at this Institute and administer the Sacraments there routinely.
8. **Radio Pacis:** This is an FM Radio Station belonging to Arua Diocese. The Missionaries of Jesus the Divine Master carry out the work of evangelization through Social Media and Communication. The Radio Station is under the Directorship of the Missionaries of Jesus the Divine Mother. The Radio Station serves the four Dioceses in Northern Uganda, as well as the Eastern Democratic Republic of the Congo and South Sudan.

9. **Sacred Heart of Jesus Parish - Eruba:** The Missionaries of Jesus the Divine Master are providing Parochial services as well as services at the two (2) Secondary Schools and five (5) Primary Schools, one (1) Institution and four (4) Outstations (Chapels). The

Missionaries provide Christian Education in these Schools and administer Sacraments in them routinely.

10. **Muni University:** The Missionaries of Jesus the Divine Master are providing Chaplaincy services, guidance and counselling as well as serving as Professors and Administrators.



11. **Chaplaincy for the Legion of Mary:** The Missionaries of Jesus the Divine Master are providing a Diocesan Chaplain for the Legion of Mary in the Diocese of Arua.
12. **Arua Core Primary Teacher College:** This Teacher Training College trains primary School Teachers in the entire West Nile Region of Uganda. The Missionaries of Jesus the Divine Master is providing Chaplaincy, shaping the teacher trainees for better and morally upright teachers.

KAMPALA ARCHDIOCESE:

13. **Uganda Spiritual Formation Centre:** The Missionaries of Jesus the Divine Master are providing Chaplaincy services, guidance and counselling as well as serving as facilities in this Centre, which is owned by the Association of the Religious in Uganda (ARU).

TANZANIA

BUNDA DIOCESE

14. **St. Joseph the Worker, Mukondo Parish:** This Parish is situated in Ukerewe, Irland, on Lake Victoria. The Missionaries of Jesus the Divine Master are serving in that Parish.

15. St. Joseph the Worker Primary School: This is a Primary School in the Parish of St. Joseph the Worker, Bukondo Parish. The Missionaries of Jesus the Divine Master are serving as teachers in this Primary School in Ireland, shaping the future of the young stars.

16. Lake Zone Secondary School: This secondary School belongs to the Diocese of Bunda, but is situated in Mwanza Archdiocese. The Missionaries of Jesus the Divine Master are serving in providing administrative roles as well as Chaplaincy.
